The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:

Preliminary Issue:

An application for a postponement was made on behalf of the respondent because its only witness, a director of the company was out of the country on holiday. The Tribunal was satisfied that the respondent was properly notified of the Hearing and if a postponement application were made within 5 days of notification it would probably have been granted. A postponement will only be granted on the day of Hearing in exceptional circumstances. The postponement application was refused.

Appellant's Case:

The appellant gave evidence. He worked as a security officer in the Lourdes Hospital. The respondent lost the security contract and he was advised there was no more work. He worked for a time with the new contractor.

Respondent's Case:

The redundancy was disputed as the appellant was offered other work in Dublin. He had been issued with a P.45.

Determination:

The Tribunal is satisfied that the appellant's position was redundant and that he is entitled to a lump sum payment under the Redundancy Payments Acts, 1967 to 2003, based on the following information:
