The decision of the Tribunal was as follows: -

Claimant's Case

The claimant told the Tribunal that she requested unpaid leave from the respondent to go away with the Army Reserve but this was refused and on receipt of a letter from an Army Captain she was given a week's unpaid leave. When she returned from unpaid leave on 6 October 2008 she was summoned to the office and dismissed. The claimant stated that she was given her notice pay but that she did not receive notice and she did not receive a letter regarding a warning.

Respondent's Case

The respondent told the Tribunal that the claimant was given the minimum notice pay that she was entitled to.

Determination
