The decision of the Tribunal was as follows:

Claimant's Case:

The appellant commenced his employment with the respondent company on 10<sup>th</sup> September 2000. His employment ceased on 21<sup>st</sup> December 2007. The appellant gave evidence that he took a three-month break from October 2002 until January 2003 to go to the USA. However, the respondent continued to pay the appellant's social insurance contribution. The appellant was seeking a redundancy payment for the full duration of his employment.

Respondent's Case:

The respondent agreed that the appellant was entitled to a redundancy payment, but disputed from which date. He had continued to pay the appellant's social insurance and did not issue a P45 during his time abroad as the appellant was required to show that he had a job to return to.

The Tribunal finds that the appellant is entitled to a redundancy lump sum payment based on the following criteria:
