Background

There was no appearance by the claimant at the hearing. The representative for the claimant submitted a copy of an e-mail he had received from his client, dated 18th April 2012 and stated that he only had sight of this on the morning of the hearing. He then applied to have the hearing adjourned to a later date.

The representative for the respondent had no objection to the hearing being adjourned.

The Tribunal referred to the e-mail and enquired as to what the claimant meant by "I am trapped in Mauritainia" and was told by the claimant's representative that the term was being used loosely and that the claimant was not ill or being held against his will.

The Tribunal allowed for a recess until 15:25 in order for the claimant's representative to attempt further communication with his client but he was unsuccessful in these attempts.

Determination

There was no appearance by the claimant and the Tribunal is satisfied that he was properly notified of the hearing. Given that he was notified by registered post on 9th March 2012, the claimant had ample opportunity to make arrangements to attend the hearing. Therefore this case is dismissed for want of prosecution.
